Greater Hamilton Health Network

Dr. Mohamad Alshurafa is a family physician and board member of the Hamilton Family Health Team. Dr. Alshurafa has practiced internationally in Australia and Canada, including in rural and urban settings and within varying practice settings. He has over 10 years of leadership experience in the health care sector including in family practice digital health, and family health organizations. He serves on the UpToDate (CFPC) planning board and is an Assistant Clinical Professor at McMaster University and the University of Toronto. He has worked with the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care and understands the funder perspective and funding models. Most recently Dr. Alshurafa was the HFHT's Digital Health Ambassador and, in that role, represented the HFHT at various planning tables.

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Middlesex London Ontario Health Team

Dr. Gordon Schacter practiced comprehensive family medicine in London for 29 years before retiring in July of 2024. He is the Regional Clinical Lead, Primary Care for Ontario Health West. In addition, he is the Middlesex London Ontario Health Team Clinical Lead for Primary Care, and sits on the executive of the Middlesex London Primary Care Network. He was the chair of the Ontario Primary Care Council from October 2021 until April of 2023. Dr. Schacter is also an adjunct professor in the Department of Family Medicine, Schulich School of Medicine and Dentistry at Western University. He has held previous leadership roles on the executive of the Section on General and Family Practice at the OMA and at the South West LHIN, as the London Middlesex clinical lead, South West LHIN primary care lead, and as the primary care lead for the South West Diabetes Regional Coordination Centre. Dr. Schacter completed a master's certificate program in physician leadership from the Schulich School of Business, York University, and the physician leadership development program for advanced leaders with the OMA/Joule. In 2022, Dr. Schacter was awarded the Canadian Certified Physician Executive credential by the Canadian Society of Physician Leaders.



Burlington Ontario Health Team

Dr. Mike Mills is a relief Hospitalist at Joseph Brant Hospital in Burlington, where he also assists the Joint Replacement Orthopaedic Teams as a surgical assistant. He leads the hospital's Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) Program, a role requiring sensitivity and collaboration. His work is grounded in family medicine principles and supported by extensive experience in building strong relationships across health disciplines. With nearly five decades in family practice, Dr. Mills has worked in various clinical settings, including group practices, hospitalbased care, and child foster care. He has navigated both capitation and fee-forservice models, always drawn to innovative and collaborative work. A career highlight has been his locum work in New Zealand over the past 20 years, where he utilized HealthPathways to guide diagnostic decisions and care planning. Dr. Mills is a Certificant and Fellow of the College of Family Physicians of Canada and recently completed the Canadian MAiD Curriculum. Despite joking about "trying to be a retired family doctor," he remains passionate about learning, contributing, and being inspired by his colleagues. The evolving nature of medicine and the richness of human connection make his work deeply rewarding.
